The Acton Cup is one of the region's most prestigious trophies, a knock-out competition between 32 clubs in the North East Cheshire tennis league. Played over the course of the season it involves ladies' and men's singles and doubles as well as mixed doubles. Prestbury reached the final and then triumphed over teams from 'The Northern' in a thrilling 3-2 victory. It is some 44 years since the club last won this trophy, a huge achievement.
